

As we are going into the 3rd year of dealing with the pandemic crisis, I take a pause and reflect on how ASIA Families still made impact on the community we serve despite of all hardships: We had to turn our main programs from in-person offering to virtual sessions and had to cancel Korea tours and all other gatherings for the first two years into the pandemic. ASIA Families has been able to weather the storm alongside with you.

From the bottom of my heart, I thank you all who have supported ASIA Families as donors, program leaders, volunteers, and participants. All of you enable us to keep advancing our vision. Because of your generous support, we were able to continue to offer the needed services for adoption community. 




Number of hours Volunteers gave last year



Where our funding is coming from


Where our funding goes

Programs

Korean Culture School

ASIA Families offers the only monthly Korean culture school that brings together children, teens, parents, adult adoptees, and members of the broader Korean American community in a fun and welcoming environment.





Camp Rice Family Culture Camp

Each July, ASIA – Families sponsors a three-day family sleepover camp in the greater Washington, DC area. Camp Rice has programs for children, teens, adult adoptees, and parents.

Korea Bridge Tours

ASIA Families sponsors summer homeland trips to South Korea for adult adoptees and families with children adopted from Korea. Led by Grace, the tours draw upon her expert knowledge of the language, country, culture, and the international adoption experience to offer adoptees and families the trip of a lifetime.
